JUST READ THE INSTRUCTIONS

Years back we would water our horses at the Ranch with water troughs. This way of keeping them supplied with fresh water worked fairly well in the summer, but when winter was upon us it became rather challenging. We would have to break the ice and shovel it out of the water troughs. By spring we had a huge pile of ice! Using a hammer, hatchet, and shovel was a tough way to keep fresh water available.

As time went on we decided to invest in some automatic waterers. The advertisement said, "NO freeze ups! Easy clean - Fresh water without the hassle." At the start of that first winter things went really well. Then it got extremely cold, and froze up. We had to get extension cords, and a heat gun to thaw it out. What a disappointment! The next four winters it only got worse. Staff spent many early morning hours in 20 to 30 below zero temps thawing the automatic waterers out.

This past winter I was told by Willy, that the water heater had stopped working all together. When I went to see what could be done, I found that the thermostat had broken, and some of the insulation had melted from use of the heat gun. I called the company to order new parts and through my conversation with the rep was given some advice to help fix the original freeze up problem. As I hung up the phone I realized I had made a huge mistake. I hadn't read and followed all of the instructions that came with the waterer. After installing the new parts and applying the newly learned instructions we have not had a freeze up since!

Years of trouble, many cold hours spent thawing the waterer, winters of stressing over

horses having fresh water could have been avoided.

Through this, God has shown me that the same thing happens when we ignore His instruction manual, the Bible. When we do things our own way we end up with years of misery, pain, trouble, and stress. His instructions are clear on how to live. Please consider taking a closer look with me at God's instructions to us. Lets commit to reading the Bible everyday and with Christ's help do what it says to truly live a blessed life.
